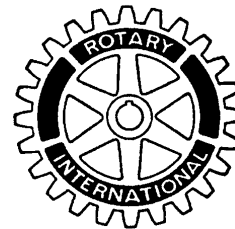

## A Message from RI President Bhichai Rattakul

We have reached the midpoint of this Rotary year, and it has been a challenging six months, marked by economic uncertainty and instability around the world. Despite their own hardships, Rotarians are doing their part to bring peace and harmony to troubled areas. Through humanitarian service projects, they are offering hope to those who have almost given up on life and are helping to *Sow the Seeds of Love*, which have taken root and changed so many lives for the better.



As we enter the second half of the year, I would like to ask Rotarians to look within themselves and ask, "Can I do even more?" I would like to ask members to challenge themselves to achieve an even higher level of service. Such a commitment reflects the very essence of a Rotarian.

Each club needs to evaluate its progress at this point. When I had the honor to begin serving in this position in July 2002, I appealed to all Rotarians to focus on three major areas: increasing membership based on specific club goals and the classification system, supporting at least one project or program of The Rotary Foundation of RI, and initiating or continuing at least one activity within each of the four Avenues of Service (Club, Vocational, Community, and International). I did not introduce any new programs because I felt that concentrating on these basics would result in a strong, well-balanced club.

During my travels, I have witnessed the dedication and tireless work of Rotarians around the globe. They are an inspiration to their clubs and their communities. I am gratified that Rotarians have wholeheartedly embraced this year's polio eradication fundraising campaign, Fulfilling Our Promise: Eradicate Polio, to raise US\$80 million to help eradicate polio by 2005. ## Board Minutes for November

The November 18, 2002 meeting of directors of the Alton-Godfrey Rotary Club was called to order at 5:00 p.m., by President Ed Morrissey. Others in attendance were Mike Seymour, Tom Juravich, Sharon Johnson, Bill Moyer, John Rain, Scott Neudecker, Mike McCormick, Sam Stemm, Bob Fowler, Dan Saeger, Larry Thompson, Jeannine Kelly, Von VanDiver, Martha Morse, Ford Phillips and the Executive Secretary Melissa Seymour.

On a motion by Rain, seconded by Stemm the minutes were approved. On a motion by Juravich, seconded by Stemm the treasurer's report was approved.

The memberships of Gail Weinrich, Frank Dwyer, and Roger Hoffard were accepted by the Board on a motion by Moyer, seconded by Neudecker.

In Community Service Kelly said the committee would meet tonight after the regular meeting and present a report at next months Board meeting. Community Christmas 2002 is collecting food, clothing, and toys for those in need. It was decided that Alton-Godfrey Rotary would focus on one item, coats. It was suggested that since the Alton Belle is not contributing \$2000 for the purchase of new coats that we could do this. McCormick suggested that we have members bring in coats in on 12/16/02. A motion was made by Johnson, seconded by Phillips that coats be collected with the final date being 12/16/02. This was amended by Rain to have the coats brought to the Club Assembly. The motion passed as amended.

In Vocational Service, tonight is Student of the Month.

In International service there was no

report.

In Club Service, McCormick stated that the 11/25/02 meeting with be a club assembly with election of officers and directors. Jeannine will be nominated treasurer.

For the Foundation Moyer reported that Alton-Godfrey Rotary has raised \$14,166.30 for the Polio Eradication 2002 Campaign. This is 14 Paul Harris Fellows. He would like to see the club make the \$15,000 mark. It was approved on a motion by Moyer, seconded by McCormick to use fine and 50-50 money to make up the difference.

In Fundraising, Johnson stated that items are still needed for the Hatha-way Holiday Pops auction.

In old business, McCormick contacted 4 other places to see if they would work for our meetings. Johnson's Corner is too small; Sportsmen's Club is not interested; Sports Tap is interested with meals being \$11.00; Moonlight is also interested with meals being \$9.00. Seymour did point out this is not the first time we have looked for a new meeting place. There was concern that Moonlight may be too far out. The Board did authorize McCormick to book a meeting at Moonlight in January before we make a commitment. The Executive Secretary review is due to the Board in January or February. The request from Alton Park & Rec for the carillon donation was referred to Community Service. There was no interest from the membership to participate in the Alton Human Relations Commission.
